Children's Dental Health



Cavities (also known as caries or tooth decay) are one of the most common chronic diseases of childhood in the United States. Untreated cavities can cause pain and infections that may lead to problems with eating, speaking, playing, and learning. Children who have poor oral health often miss more school and receive lower grades than children who don't. The good news is that cavities are preventable!

For babies:

- Wipe gums twice a day with a soft, clean cloth in the morning after the first feeding and right before bed to wipe away bacteria and sugars that can cause cavities.
- When teeth come in, start brushing twice a day with a soft, small-bristled toothbrush and plain water.
- Visit the dentist by your baby's first birthday to spot signs of problems early.
- Talk to your dentist or doctor about putting fluoride varnish on your child's teeth as soon as the first tooth appears.

For children:

- Brush their teeth twice a day with fluoride toothpaste.
- Be sure their toothbrush has soft bristles (the package will tell you if they're soft). Get a new toothbrush every 3 months.
- Floss their teeth once a day making sure to get between the very back teeth as well.
- Ask your child's dentist to apply dental sealants when appropriate.

Supplies:

- Pumpkin
- 2 bottles of clear Elmer's glue
- · Liquid starch
- Pumpkin carving tool(to cut the top of the pumpkin)
- Gloves (optional)

Instructions:

- 1. Carve out the top of the pumpkin. Using the stem, remove the top. Scoop out all the inside guts and place in a bowl.
- 2. Dump both bottles of clear glue in the bowl. Mix well with your hands.
- 3. Add 1 cup of liquid starch. Mix well with your hands. If mixture appears to stick to your hands, slowly add more liquid starch until you reach that slime consistency. It may take up to 15 minutes of mixing to reach the consistency.



Supplies:

- Pumpkin (the one used for the slime)
- Baking soda
- Vinegar
- Dish soap

Instructions:

- 1. Take your pumpkin outdoors as this will get messy!
- 2. Pour about a cup of baking soda into the pumpkin
- 3. Squirt in dish soap. About 1/4 cup will be more than enough.
- 4. Get ready to move out of the way after pouring vinegar into the pumpkin and sealing it off with the top of the pumpkin again.
- 5. Watch the volcano erupt!
